We are excited to host Pontius Family Association 2025 in Worcester, Massachusetts!

Our reunion in downtown Worcester will be very walkable, with our meetings and Worcester's tourism destinations within a mile from the Hilton Garden Inn Hotel on Major Taylor Boulevard. The location also allows for an optional day trip into Boston, before or after the reunion. July average temperatures in Worcester range from 65-84.

Options for Getting to Worcester Hilton Garden Inn from Logan Airport in Boston

Limo - Knights Limousine offers door-to-door service between Logan Airport and Worcester. Shared vans hold up to ten passengers and cost \$89 a passenger each way. Depending on the time of day, this will be a 1-2 hour drive. For scheduling, see online at <https://www.knightslimo.com/>

Rental Car - Interstate 90 runs through Logan Airport and driving to the Hilton Garden Inn in Worcester is a 1-2 hour drive with only a few turns. Parking in Worcester is across the street of the hotel for \$14.95 a day.

Train - From Logan airport, take the free MBTA Silver Line (SL1) bus from any terminal at Logan Airport to Boston's South Station. From there, take the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority (MBTA) commuter train to Worcester's Union Station. Train tickets are \$12.25 and the commute to Worcester Union Station takes an hour and a half. From Union Station, the Hilton Garden Inn Worcester is a 12-minute walk (0.7 miles) or plan for a pickup from Joan Pontius. Call Joan in advance at 443-963-4403.

VISITING BOSTON Do you want to combine your reunion with a trip to Boston? Boston is only 4 miles from Logan Airport and luggage storage locations are located throughout the city. The Freedom Trail in Boston is a 2.5-mile marked path that connects 16 historic sites, telling the story of the American Revolution. Options to visit Boston with other PFA members include:

BOSTON THURSDAY at Noon Meet PFA's own history aficionado Dave Reno at the front gates of the Massachusetts Statehouse (24 Beacon St.) for a two hour tour of Boston including the Boston Athenaeum, one of the country's oldest libraries. Use your registration form to sign up, so we know who to expect.

BOSTON SUNDAY TOUR Meet Joan, David, and other PFA members after breakfast for a day trip into Boston.

REUNION HIGHLIGHTS

MEETINGS

Thursday evening: Our Board of Directors meeting will be held at Jean McDonough Arts Center JMAC (20 Franklin St). JMAC is a half a mile walk from the hotel and sits alongside the Worcester Commons and City Hall.

Our Friday morning and afternoon genealogy meeting will also be held at JMAC (20 Franklin St). The JMAC is next to several restaurants for lunch.

Our Saturday morning meeting, lunch, and Banquet Dinner will be held at First Baptist Church (111 Park Ave). The church is a walkable mile from our hotel and has free parking for those who choose to drive.

Banquet Dinner: After dinner, along with our traditional raffle, we'll have ***Pontius Got Talent!*** Sign up for a three minute slot to share your special talent or relay a story from your Pontius family history. Need ideas for a reunion story? How about something related to Boston, smiles, or athletics? Worcester is home of the Smiley Face and the museum of legendary cyclist Major Taylor.

POINTS OF INTEREST IN WORCESTER

AMERICAN ANTIQUARIAN SOCIETY (AAS) (185 Salisbury St.) Use registration form to sign up for THURSDAY OR FRIDAY tours. Worcester is home to the American Antiquarian Society. Their website reads: *Since its founding in 1812 by Revolutionary War patriot and printer Isaiah Thomas, AAS has assembled what is today the world's largest and most accessible collection of books, pamphlets, broadsides, newspapers, periodicals, children's literature, music, and graphic arts material printed before the twentieth century in what is now the United States.* The AAS offers guided tours for up to 15 participants. **To help us plan groups of 15, use the registration form to indicate any of the time slots that you would be able to attend.**

FRIDAY AFTERNOON - walking distance from our morning meeting place of JMAC are several restaurants for lunch as well as:

WORCESTER HISTORICAL MUSEUM (30 Elm St) Worcester's local history museum is an 8 minute walk from JMAC. Worcester is home of the Smiley Face!

SHOPPING AT THE CROMPTON COLLECTIVE (138 Green St) is 0.5 miles from JMAC.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON -After lunch at the First Baptist Church, stroll back to the hotel and stop to see:

MAJOR TAYLOR MUSEUM (In the Courthouse Lofts at 2 Main St) Major Taylor was an American professional cyclist. He has been called "the first Black American global sports superstar." We have arranged for the museum to be open for us after our Saturday lunch.

SALISBURY HOUSE (61 Harvard St) The Greek Revival building was constructed 1836-1838. Open Thursday-Saturday 1-4. Adults \$5, Students \$4. Free to 18 years old and younger.

WORCESTER ART MUSEUM (55 Salisbury St) The museum houses over 38,000 works of art dating from antiquity to the present day and representing cultures from all over the world. Open Wednesday-Sunday 10-4. Adults \$18, Students & Seniors \$14. Free to 17 years old and younger.

MESSAGE FROM THE ARCHIVIST by Micheal Pontious:

We now have four PFA Id numbers tied to Mary Catherine Pontius 1725-1802. And I was wrong about a Mathias Pontius not having a PFA ID number. After the last Newsletter, I was contacted by Ronald Mathias Pontius (1932) M-34 who had just read our newsletter. We had a nice long phone conversation about "M" ID numbers and his family. After the call, I found him on our membership list, and he already had an ID number. His grandfather was Mathias Pontius (1856-1902) who immigrated in 1882. He married Margaretha Kein (1859-1931) in Chicago, Illinois in 1884.

Betty and I were contacted by a Carlina Burker of Franklin County, Pennsylvania, who just wanted to let us know that she had found our website very helpful in her research of her ancestor Mary Elizabeth Pontius (1725-1781) /John Detrick Aurand (1725-1807). I did some preliminary research on Mary Elizabeth and found some conflicting information. She has Mary Elizabeth as a child of Johannes Pontius, but she would have been born when her father was 8. I am not sure where she ties into the Pontius line.



The Pontius Family Tree has 29,029 individuals listed now. Most of the increase was generated from determining PFA ID numbers.

They explained how "back in the day" people had to harvest ice to keep food cold. Dairies especially needed it to keep the milk cold. There were two oxen there pulling the large chunks of ice on a big wooden sleigh. We walked to the pond and watched them cut and saw the ice and load it into the sleigh.


Just another fun thing to do in Pennsylvania.

The Dreibelbis farm in Virginville, Pennsylvania, was founded in 1778 by Jacob B. Dreibelbis, son of the original family immigrant, John Jacob Dreibelbis.

It is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is the second oldest continuously owned family farm in Berks County.

The ice house is made of stone. During winter months, ice blocks were cut from the frozen pond onsite and were carted 300 yds to the ice house for storage. The large nails protruding from the exterior walls would have enabled dense, leafy grape vines to grow there during summer, helping to lower the temperature of the ice house and keep the ice frozen longer
